


Wisconsin Pays for Empty State Office Buildings While Staff Work From Home [WRN Voices]

This Month In History

December 2, 1823 - President James Monroe introduced his "Monroe Doctrine" during his annual message to Congress, prohibiting any further colonization of the American continents by European powers, stating, "We should consider any attempt on their part to extend their system to any portion of this hemisphere as dangerous to our peace and safety..."







December 25–26, 1776 during the American Revolutionary War, was the first move in a surprise attack organized by General George Washington, the commander-in-chief of the Continental Army, against Hessian forces garrisoned at Trenton, who were German mercenaries hired by the British. After crossing the Delaware River, Washington and his troops successfully attacked the Hessian forces in the Battle of Trenton on the morning of December 26, 1776.

United States President Theodore Roosevelt dispatched 16 U.S. Navy battleships of the Atlantic Fleet on a worldwide voyage of circumnavigation from December 16th, 1907 to February 22nd, 1909. The hulls were painted white, the Navy's peacetime color scheme, and decorated with gilded Scrollwork with a red, white, and blue banner on their bows. These ships later became to be know as the Great White Fleet





This Month In History Continued...

December 19, 1732 – Benjamin Franklin first published Poor Richard's Almanac containing weather predictions, humor, proverbs and epigrams, eventually selling nearly 10,000 copies per year.

December 16, 1773 - The
Boston Tea Party occurred as
colonial activists disguised as
Mohawk Indians boarded
British ships anchored in
Boston Harbor and dumped
342 containers of expensive
tea into the water.

December 17, 1777 - At Valley Forge in Pennsylvania, the Continental Army led by General George Washington settled in for the winter.

December 15, 1791 - The Bill of Rights (first 10 amendments to the U.S. Constitution) became effective following ratification by Virginia.

December 14, 1799 - George Washington died at Mount Vernon.







December 17, 1903 – After three years of experimentation, Orville and Wilbur Wright achieved the first powered, controlled airplane flights. They made four flights near Kitty Hawk, North Carolina, the longest lasting about a minute.



December 1, 1955 – The birth of the modern American civil rights movement occurred as Rosa Parks was arrested in Montgomery, Alabama, for refusing to give up her seat to a white man and move to the back section of a municipal bus. Her arrest resulted in a year-long boycott of the city bus system by African Americans and led to legal actions ending racial segregation on municipal buses throughout the South.
